Sermon: "Breaking Molds the Other Way"

For we are what he has made us, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand so that we may walk in them.

Ephesians 2:10 (NRSV)

Thoughts to Consider for the Sermon

1. No doubt you've heard the phrase, "They broke the mold when they made *so and so*." Typically, this is something that is said as a complement. It's another way of saying, that someone is unique, wonderful, and someone to be cherished! Who is someone in your life – especially in your faith life – who you feel was a mold breaker? You know, their faith life is seemingly so wonderful that you really do admire them. What makes you think that about them? Do you aspire to be more like them?
2. Sometimes, we're not too kind to ourselves. We don't always think of ourselves as mold-breakers. It's not that we don't think we're important in the grand scheme of things. It's just that we don't always see ourselves being named by someone else as being worth admiring, like in

that first question. What deficits in your faith life are you most aware of?

3. The trick behind the first and second questions is that we all answer both of them. We all look up to others, admiring their faith, and yet we all assume that we're not the mold-breakers. The reason for this is that we all make assumptions of what the mold is in the first place. We assume that we have some form of defect, and so to break the mold would be incredibly premature. What if we are beautifully created by God, and yet always being worked on? What if the "mold" isn't exactly what we think it is?
